



"I got to go full circle – from front door to staff member," says Kristie, a graduate of our Discipleship Recovery Program, describing her journey from struggle to strength.

When she came to WRM in 2018, she was a broken woman. Chronic health issues had led to an addiction that ended her career, separated her from her loved ones and left her homeless.

With the care and guidance of our staff and volunteers, she allowed the Lord to rewrite her life story, based on her passion for helping others. She worked at our front desk, served as a mentor for other women in the program and helped with community fundraisers where she grew to love the people of Casper.

After graduation she felt God calling her back home to Washington, where He has restored her relationship with her family. Her health has improved dramatically, and she joined a church where she continues to be supported in her walk with the Lord.

Her long-term goal is to run a ministry, "helping people that help other people," she says. "That would be an excellent way to use the talents and experience WRM has given me." For now she enjoys working

through temporary agencies where she has many opportunities to share her journey and the message of Christ's love.

This summer she came back to visit our staff and guests, and it was a heartwarming reunion. "It's like having another family," she says. "It's the birthplace of my soul."
