

An Interview with Phillip (Flip) Cooper of Rocky Mountain Oilfield Warehouse




## Q: When/How did RMOW begin? Can you provide a basic history of your company?

A: The company began as M & C Sales in 1954. It was founded by Andy Mason and my dad, Phillip Cooper, in 1954 in Casper, WY. The focus of the company was supplying the oilfield with drilling equipment, paint and supplies. We expanded into production supplies in 1964. Over the years, we have expanded into Rock Springs, WY; Ft. Morgan, CO; and Dickinson, ND. We supply regulators, valves and accessories that facilitate the production of crude oil and natural gas.

### Q: How would you sum up your partnership with Wyoming Rescue Mission?

A: We decided to partner with a faith-based organization that cares for individuals with great compassion. Besides, God owns everything... we just manage it.



Meet Brennon who is thankful for your support!



Brennon and his family lived a nomadic life – traveling from state to state with their mobile home while his father pursued a better job and more stable future. The persistence paid off and when Brennon was 9, Casper became their permanent home.

But eager for acceptance and longing to make new friends, Brennon was vulnerable and fell in with the wrong crowd. Succumbing to peer pressure, he adopted destructive behaviors that, as he grew older, left him battling for sobriety... struggling to hold a job... pursuing unhealthy relationships... and often experiencing homelessness.

His challenges escalated until finally he was forced to make a choice: go to jail, or join our Discipleship Program and turn his life around.

Although Brennon had never considered himself spiritual, he did have an old Bible. "The binding was coming off, it was in three clumps and the pages were falling out," he says. So he felt welcome and blessed when a fellow guest gave him a new one. Most importantly, it jump-started his relationship with God.

In addition to faith-based studies, he volunteers at our Rescued Treasures Thrift Store, works in the kitchen and takes part in classes that help guests become healthy, productive and independent members of society. He's grateful for the study skills he is learning in our care and plans to go to school for a trade he can use to help his community.

### IRA Charitable Rollover

If you are 73 or older and have an IRA but are making charitable gifts from your checkbook, you are missing a very important tax break! A gift from your IRA is considered a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) which counts toward your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) for the tax period.

Under the new tax law, many people's itemized deductions do not exceed the new higher standard deduction. Giving from your IRA may be your only way to give and save on taxes at the same time. Take advantage of the IRA charitable rollover gifting strategy to support the work of charities that mean the most to you.

Here are a few of the benefits you will enjoy:

- Avoid taxes on transfers of up to \$100,000 from your IRA to charity.
- Satisfy required minimum distribution for the year.
- Reduce taxable income, even if you do not itemize deductions.

Make a gift that is not subject to the 50 percent deduction limits on charitable gifts. Help further the work of charitable organizations and causes you're passionate about.
